Across Massachusetts, more than 20,000 families are caring for a family member with an intellectual or developmental disability in the family home. While these families represent 60% of the individuals served by DDS, family support for caregivers is only 3.5% of the DDS budget. Family Support & Respite Services are 75% - 80% less expensive than out of home placement. Families are the largest group of service providers in the state. If family members were no longer available, the economic cost to the state would increase astronomically.
