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A Message from our President/CEO and Board Chair

As ADDP reflects on our activities over the past fiscal year, the theme and the value of *working in partnership* rings through and through the advocacy work of our association and its resulting outcomes.

By working closely with our state agency partners, in addition to an increase of \$40 million in the MassHealth budget for Day Habilitation Services, our members saw an unprecedented, largest Chapter 257 Rate Reserve of \$390 million which included rate increases of 20.3% - 22.6% for Department of Developmental Services (DDS) In-Home Supports, Adult Long-Term Residential (ALTR). Many of these rate increases included staff salaries benchmarked at the 53rd percentile of MA Bureau of Labor Statistics for certain job categories and direct support professionals and LPN median starting salaries beginning at \$20/hour which was closer to the 63rd percentile. This increase in staff salary benchmarks was a direct result of the joint workforce advocacy of the Collaborative (the Association of Behavioral Healthcare (ABH), ADDP, the Children's League and the Providers' Council) working in partnership with the Executive Office of Health and Human Services (EOHHS).

ADDP's second Workforce Metrics Staffing Report, released in the fall of 2023, captured vacancy rates and their impact on programs across six key program areas and provided the data which supported our workforce advocacy. The survey received notable media coverage, including articles and reports from *The Boston Globe*, WBUR, *Massachusetts Non-Profit News*, and the *Massachusetts State House News Service*.

Other important partnerships included:
ADDP and the Massachusetts Day
Habilitation Coalition (MDHC) working
in close collaboration with MassHealth
over a year-long project to revamp
the Day Hab Assessment Tool and
expand the prior authorization process;
ADDP's strong relationship with The
Arc of Massachusetts supporting
mutual budget and policy priorities;
and the advocacy of the Adult Foster
Care (AFC) Advisory Group, a coalition
of AFC providers consisting of ADDP,
the Massachusetts Council for Adult
Foster Care, Mass Home Care, and

The Arc which submitted regulatory testimony regarding minimum caregiver stipends and met with Center for Health Information Analysis (CHIA) and MassHealth to discuss policy recommendations based on the Advisory Group's analysis of six years of AFC cost report data.

Our partnership with the legislature was evident in February 2024 at ADDP's Annual Legislative Budget Forum at the State House, in-person for the first time since the COVID pandemic. The event made a persuasive case that the housing crisis is, in fact, a human services crisis and it garnered significant State House News coverage.

The ADDP team remains committed to working in partnership with you so that we can best represent your organizations and missions to the administration, legislature and the general public. Our goal is to build upon these partnerships as we look ahead to our strategic priorities for FY'25.

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FY'24 Highlights

As ADDP continues to shape its strategic and operational plans for FY'25, we reflect on the significant accomplishments from FY'24. Our efforts have yielded progress in the areas of rate and funding increases, policy collaboration and legislative outreach.

Below are *key highlights* of the past fiscal year in these areas and others:



During FY'24, ADDP advocated for increased funding in a number of different service areas. As a result of our advocacy, the MassHealth budget for Day Hab increased by \$40 million, DDS In-Home Supports increased by 22.6%, DDS ALTR rates increased by 20.3% and and the DDS Shared Living rates increased by 20.95%. As a result of our collaboration with Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission (MRC), EOHHS extended accommodation rates for the Brain Injury Community Centers (BICC) until June 30, 2024, and EOHHS has committed to reviewing the program to develop Chapter 257 rates during FY'25. In addition, DDS will be providing reimbursement for residential day supports for FY'24 and is committed to working with ADDP to find a permanent solution for day supports reimbursement during FY'25.

Policy Collaboration

During FY'24, ADDP continued to work with **the Collaborative** to address Chapter 257 issues and the impact of the workforce crisis. As a result of the Collaborative's partnership on the EOHHS Workforce Work Group, we saw increases in workforce staffing compensation above the 53rd percentile for certain job categories and consideration of reimbursement for community-based provider retirement benefits.

ADDP has been working closely with DDS and providers throughout the year to implement a new assessment for individuals in Shared Living created by ADDP members and

for rates reflecting the actual cost of providing this unique service.

ADDP continued to chair the AFC Advisory Group, a coalition of AFC providers consisting of ADDP,

the Massachusetts Council for Adult
Foster Care (MCAFC), Mass Home Care, and

The Arc of Massachusetts. These organizations individually and collectively support and advocate on behalf of more than 13,000 MassHealth members who access AFC services, their live-in caregivers and families, and the vast majority of Medicaid-participating provider organizations. The AFC Advisory Group submitted regulatory testimony regarding minimum caregiver stipends and met with CHIA and MassHealth to discuss policy recommendations based on analysis of six years of cost report data.

ADDP and the Massachusetts Day Habilitation Coalition (MDHC) collaborated with MassHealth over a year-long project to revamp the **Day Hab Assessment Tool** and expand the prior authorization process to all individuals. ADDP and MDHC were effective in their advocacy and will continue to monitor the impact once the new system changes go live on August 1, 2024.







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On the national level, ADDP advocated with the federal Office of Management and Budget to create a standard occupation code (SOC) for direct support professionals and partnered with other state-wide ANCOR provider organizations in advocacy to CMS regarding the payment adequacy provision in the proposed rule *Ensuring Access to Medicaid Services*.

ADDP Initiatives

ADDP released its second **Workforce Metrics Staffing Report** in the fall of 2023, capturing vacancy rates and their impact on programs across six key program areas. Key findings revealed that overall vacancy rates remained high at 26%, with nursing and direct care professions being the most challenging to fill, and significant waitlists persisting in day programs.

The survey received **notable media coverage**, including articles and reports from *The Boston Globe*, WBUR, *Massachusetts Non-Profit News*, and *Massachusetts State House News Service*.

ADDP continued its **Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Initiative** with the **DEI Connect Training Series**, our **yearly Juneteenth Celebration**, and our **DEI Awards**, which are presented during the September Annual Membership Meeting.

Legislative Outreach / Relationships

In February 2024, ADDP hosted its **Legislative Budget Forum at the State House**, in-person for the first time since the beginning of the COVID pandemic. The event made a persuasive case that the housing crisis is, in fact, a human services crisis, and it garnered significant *State House News* coverage.

Following a welcome from Representative Jay D. Livingstone, Chairperson, Joint Committee on Children, Families & Persons with Disabilities Committee and a presentation of data from ADDP's October *Workforce Metrics Survey*, marquis speakers included: Secretary Ed Augustus, Massachusetts Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities; Kim McElholm,

President/CEO, Cape Abilities; and Alissa Magnotta, CEO, Housing Assistance Corporation. Senator Cindy Friedman, Chairperson, Joint Committee on Health Care Financing, was acknowledged as the ADDP Legislator of the Year following remarks from Senate President Karen Spilka. The policy position that the housing and workforce crises are inextricably linked is now being used in multiple other human service and healthcare policy discussions directly because of ADDP's framing the issue as such.

ADDP submitted written testimony in support of Governor Healey's Affordable Homes Act to the extent that it will increase affordable housing stock, thereby making careers in human services more economically viable. That would help decrease staff vacancy rates, in turn increasing the number of people served. Caregivers who are currently foregoing paid work outside the home could then return to the workforce because their loved ones can finally return to fully staffed ADDP member organizations.

Finally, more than **870 letters were sent to legislators from ADDP members** through the ADDP action center powered by Quorum.

Trainings and Events

There was no shortage of trainings and events for ADDP members during FY'24 beginning with our **Annual Membership**Meeting in September at the Doubletree Hotel in Westborough.

We continued our quarterly **HR Compliance Updates** during the year from ADDP Business Member EANE, **Lunch & Learns** from ADDP Business Members Navigating Life, PelMeds, and Therap, and finished FY'24 with our signature event: the **LEAD!**Conference. This year's theme was *Unlocking Potential: Insights* on *Employee Engagement!* It was a very well attended event (500 attendees and 33 exhibitors) and the feedback from attendees was extremely positive. We look forward to LEAD! 2025!
