

ADDP Day Services Waitlist Survey November 29, 2021

Key Highlights

- 1. Respondents and Total Qualified Bidders
 - a. 71 respondents completed the survey [62 operate a Community-Based Day Services (CBDS) program, 42 operate a Group Supported Employment (GSE) program, and 52 operate a Day Habilitation program].
 - b. The total number of *qualified bidders* for each service is 126 for CBDS, 89 for GSE, and approximately 71 for Day Habilitation (latter is a pre-pandemic number and does not account for 12 permanent site closures during to the pandemic).
 - c. Based on qualified bidders, ADDP day services waitlist survey respondents account for approximately 49% CBDS, 47% GSE, and 73% Day Habilitation of the total providers.
- 2. Of the 71 survey respondents who operate a day program, 90% have a Day Habilitation waitlist, 77% have a CBDS waitlist, and 54% have a Group Supported Employment (GSE) waitlist (average across both formerly served and new referral groups).
- 3. Across all three (3) programs, more formerly served/enrolled individuals (pre-COVID) are on a waitlist as compared to new referrals:
 - a. CBDS: As high as 2,147 former individuals and 700 new referrals.
 - b. GSE: As high as 960 former individuals and 300 new referrals.
 - c. Day Habilitation: As high as 2,571 former individuals and 830 new referrals.
- 4. Range of Total Individuals Waiting for Service(s):
 - a. <u>CBDS</u> Total waiting for this service ranges as <u>high as 2,847</u> individuals and as low as 1,771 individuals (*includes both formerly served and new referrals*).
 - b. <u>Group Supported Employment</u> Total waiting for this service ranges as <u>high as</u> <u>1,260</u> individuals and as low as 609 individuals (*includes both formerly served and new referrals*).
 - c. <u>Day Habilitation</u> Total waiting for this service ranges as <u>high as 3,401</u> individuals and as low as 2,418 individuals (*includes both formerly served and new referrals*).
- 5. There is a duplicated count for "split people" (individuals who participate in two programs during the week) if they are waiting for either service.
- 6. Individuals receiving no service and those underserved (receiving less than desired service currently as compared to pre-pandemic) are included on the waitlist.
